



NPA Community Education invites you to check out the March and April classes and events that are listed in your Winter/Spring catalog or online at ce.np.k12.mn.us.


Samplings of items to put on your calendar now are:

YoPro Fitness Open House for Gr. 6-8



Building a Rain Garden


Rain Gardens are small depressed vegetated areas for retention and filtration of stormwater runoff. Compared to a traditional lawn, a rain garden allows approximately 30% more water to infiltrate into the ground. Rain gardens collect water from rooftops, sidewalks, and driveways.

If you are considering or planning on installing a garden or a landscaping project this spring, consider constructing a rain garden, which uses native plants and also can absorb rainwater into the ground and reduce stormwater runoff. Rain gardens are also an excellent choice for the low spot in your yard that holds water. Instead of filling the area in and allowing the water to flow

away, capture the water in your new beautiful rain garden.
