CodeRED

With the incredible quick fashion that summer showed up this year, Hazardous Weather Season is upon us. It is more important than ever to make sure that you and your family members are signed up for CodeRED.

CodeRED is a high-speed telephone notification system that allows public safety agencies to deliver a pre-recorded message to a targeted area of the county or city. When signing up, you choose how you want to receive emergency messages, such as by phone, text or email.

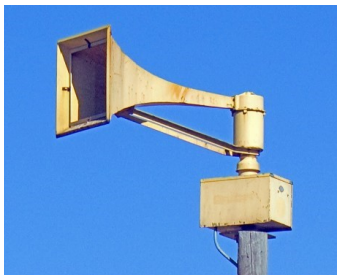
The determination to send an Emergency CodeRED message is usually based on the severity of the situation, and if there is an action the public can take to assist with or

minimize the impact of the incident. Examples would be "Be on the lookout," "Evacuate," or "Shelter in Place."

Most landline home and business numbers were automatically enrolled in the system. However, individuals must manually sign-up mobile phone and direct-dial work numbers. To register for CodeRED alerts, go to <https://public.coderedweb.com/CNE/en-US/EA5343CCoED6>

Outdoor Warning Sirens



Elko New Market is fully covered by an Outdoor Warning Siren System that consists of five sirens located around our community. The purpose of these warning sirens is to alert people that are outside of their home or business to take shelter.

The Police Department occasionally receives complaints that the sirens cannot be heard while indoors. This can be true, depending on your proximity to a siren, but this system is not intended for that. That is also why CodeRED

and weather radios exist.

New Playground Equipment at City Parks



Skyrail

Check out the newly installed Skyrail at Wagner Park. The curved track ride is designed so that riders will pick up momentum to reach the other side. Also being installed this spring, is the new Hovernet. This is a replacement item for the current Hovernet that has reached the end of its lifespan. Later this summer, the teeter totter will be replaced along with the spinner. The new version of the spinner will be handicap accessible.

Each of the playgrounds are being refreshed with wood chips that are naturally mold and decay resistant, IPEMA certified and ADA compliant. This type of wood fiber increases accessibility for wheelchairs and strollers. In addition, the belts and buckle swings have

been replaced at each of the playground parks. Check out the cool colors!

The City is now in the beginning phases of the redevelopment process of Woodcrest Park and the development of Boulder Heights Park. Public meetings will be held this summer to gather public feedback during the process. Watch for more information to come.



Hovernet

Ridgeview Estates

The City has received the final plat application for Ridgeview Estates, proposed by Chase Development, Inc. The proposed subdivision contains 29 single-family residential lots and

received preliminary approval in 2020. The development is expected to be under construction in the summer of 2022.

Illicit Discharges

Illicit discharges are comprised of contaminated discharges to any storm sewer system, including storm drains, pipes, and ditches. Pollutants like pesticides, fertilizer, oil, soil, animal waste, and more can end up in storm water runoff that eventually makes its way to the storm sewer system. These contaminants create stormwater pollution and are directly linked to local bodies of water in your community.

Some examples of illicit discharges include:

- Auto oil / fluids
- Cooking grease and household waste
- Pesticides
- Fertilizers / animal waste

- Septic sewage

Some ways you can prevent illicit discharges from contaminating clean water include:

- Never pouring anything into a storm drain.
- Repairing vehicle leaks and covering spills with litter or gravel to absorb the liquid.
- Disposing of pet waste properly.
- Using lawn chemicals in a small amount and sweeping any remnants away from driveways and roads.
- Disposing of hazardous household waste such as paint, antifreeze, and other chemicals properly.
